Visa Fraud Alert: US based missionary organisation affiliated with extreme Christian denomination caught violating Indian visa laws

Seventh Day Adventists are particularly extreme in their beliefs, referring to anything that is outside the bible as evil or of the devil. It also believes the end of the world is near and that Jesus will come soon, and that it is the catholic church who will bring about the anti-Christ before Jesus comes. One of our volunteers has personal experience with the Seventh Day Adventist denomination, which she was **forced into at a young age**. The Seventh Day Adventist denomination has had a long presence in India, and may even influence **separatist attitudes in the northeast**. Which is why it's important we catch these people. NEW DELHI: The home ministry has over the past one-and-a-half months suspended the foreign funding licence of six NGOs, which includes Christian evangelist groups and Islamic charities allegedly linked to religious conversion or funds misutilization, citing violations of the Foreign Contribution (Regulation) Act, 2010. With these actions, the total number of organisations whose FCRA registration has been suspended so far this

year has gone up to nine. While the FCRA licence of Markazul Ighasathil Kairiyathil Hindiyya, a big Kerala-based influential Sunni leader Sheikh Aboobacker Ahmed, was cancelled for non-filing of annual reports, the People's Organisation of Empowerment of Women (POEW) based in Kerala and the Russ Foundation were

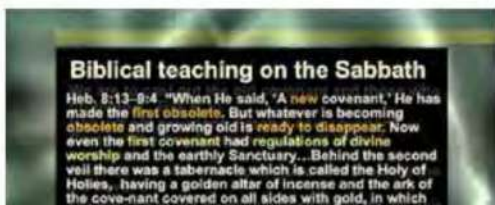

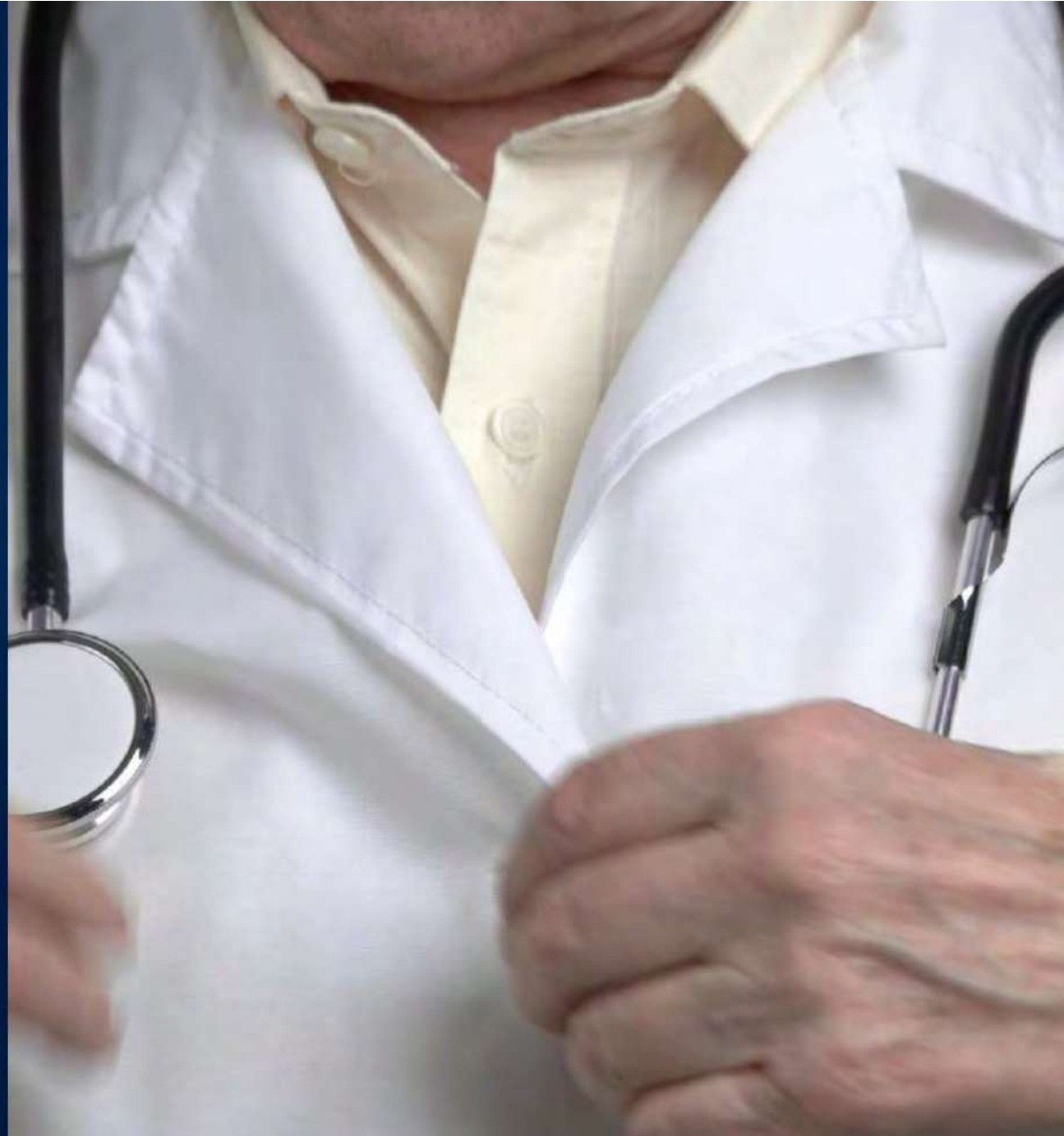



Ahmed* had never expected to explore the Bible. Raised in a devout home and shaped by the rhythms, traditions, and expectations of his community, as a member of the majority religion he had always assumed his spiritual path was settled. Yet a friendship led to honest conversations about faith, and curiosity slowly turned into personal study. Niger's Children

How do you reach a country for Christ when almost no one in that country is a Christian and it is not legal to tell someone about Jesus? That is when Christians must seek ways to find spiritually hungry people. Sometimes the church has been able to enter such countries through medical work, or schools, or through the Adventist Development and Relief Agency (ADRA). Even governments that want nothing to do with Christianity welcome ADRA projects.

The Challenge of Niger

Niger [Nee-JAIR] is a nation of about 9 million people. The majority are Muslims. It is not legal to talk about Jesus or try to convert Muslims to Christianity. When people have tried, they have been put in jail, threatened with death, or ordered to leave the country.

But God has ways. Let's visit an ADRA-sponsored school in Niger and talk with some young people who have found that Christ can make a difference in their lives.

Beauty Spa Offers Massages and Hope in the Middle East

Susan worked as a banker in her native Africa. Then she became a high-powered real estate agent.

Today she owns a beauty spa in a Middle Eastern country where wealthy Arab and expatriate women get body scrubs and massages to the soothing strains of “Amazing Grace.” They ply her for advice on how to become better wives, mothers, and citizens. The tips that Susan shares come straight from the pages of the Bible and Ellen G. White’s writings — and a swelling list of clients are lining up for more.

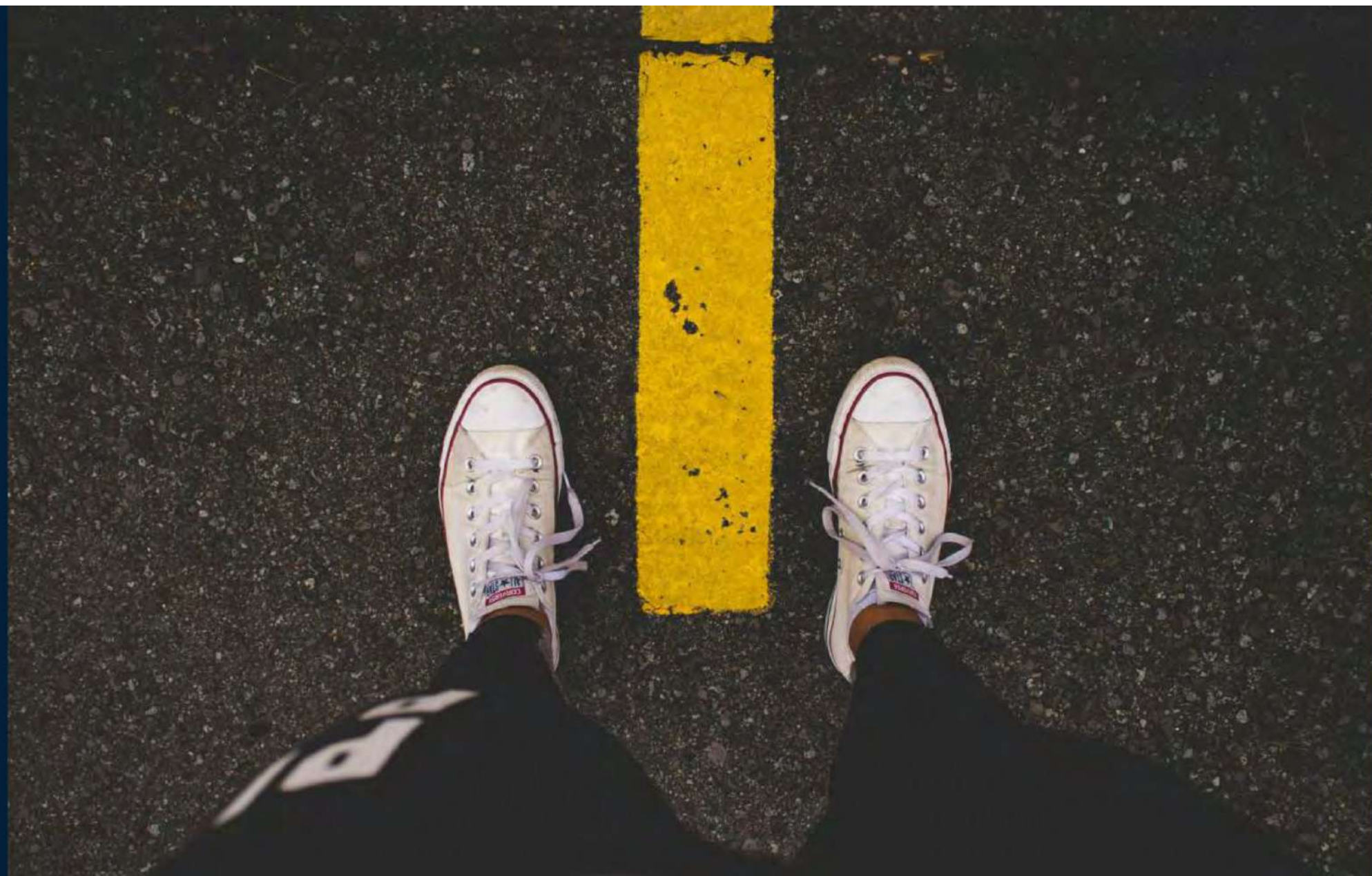
Susan is on the front-lines in a part of the world where it’s difficult to communicate the gospel message. But a small, growing number of Seventh-day Adventists are making inroads by simply befriending people at their workplaces.

“Since I have opened this beauty spa many things have happened in my life,” Susan said in an interview in a small café near her spa. “I want nothing more than my life to share God.”

Susan opened the beauty spa several years ago with no previous experience. Now she has a team of 10 employees, including five Adventist believers, who offer a full range of beauty and day spa services to a regular clientele of more than 2,000 women.

Clients learn that something is different about the spa. Hymns set to instrumental music play softly in the background. Repeat customers quickly find out that they cannot receive treatment on Saturdays. When they ask why, they learn that Susan observes the day as the biblical, seventh-day Sabbath.

“We have a goal to not only serve people but to also bring them to God,” Susan said. “The staff knows this very, very well.”



Ten Guidelines for Sharing Sensitive Mission Stories

1. Pray for God's guidance and blessing when working on sensitive stories.
2. Recognize that it is critical to share stories from sensitive mission fields and/or the Mission Refocus Windows. It's important for members and church leaders to see the challenges as well as the inspiring things that are happening.

3. Identify what makes the story sensitive. This may include the country, people group, religion, and/or government restrictions and regulations.
4. Ask yourself: Could this cause harm to the worker, the new believer, the local faith community, or the mission work? Be clear about where the story will be shared, keeping in mind that others may repost, republish, or reshare compelling stories.

5. Look for information or details that should be removed while still allowing the story to be shared. These may include last names, specific locations, public-facing business names, or identifiable images. In sensitive contexts, consider whether faces, landmarks, or other visual details could unintentionally reveal identities or locations.

6. Recognize that some workers or missionaries may be new and have a primarily monocultural experience from their home country or context. They may require guidance or training and may not be the best judges of whether something can be shared. (Training is especially important, as they may also be posting to their own social media accounts.)

7. Ensure that stories from sensitive areas such as CHUM, MENAUM, and SUD receive appropriate review.
 - Check with local conference, field, mission and/or Union
 - Check with Global Mission Centers

8. Consider how the story may appear in online search engines. Be mindful of word proximity and phrasing, as certain word combinations may appear in search summaries in unintended ways. For example, separating references to a country's primary religion from terms such as baptism may reduce the likelihood of inflammatory search descriptions. (AI-driven search continues to change this.)

9. Before reposting or sharing articles from other sources, consider whether the material was:
 - Intended for a limited audience
 - Could present challenges to that project if you share and it is seen by non-Christians.
10. When sharing stories with a limited audience, remember that sharing takes just a few clicks. It may be wise to still tell the story in such a way that the location, project and people cannot be traced.

How to identify good reviewers?

- If a story mentions a particular country that is sensitive, reach out to the local field and division communication directors to have them review the story.
- If a story mentions a particular world religion, check with Global Mission Center director:
 - GM Center for Adventist Muslim Relations
 - GM Center for Adventist Jewish Relations
 - GM Center of Adventist Buddhist Relations
 - GM Center for South Asian Religions (Hindu)
 - GM Center for Secular and Post-Christian Mission
 - GM Center for Urban Mission

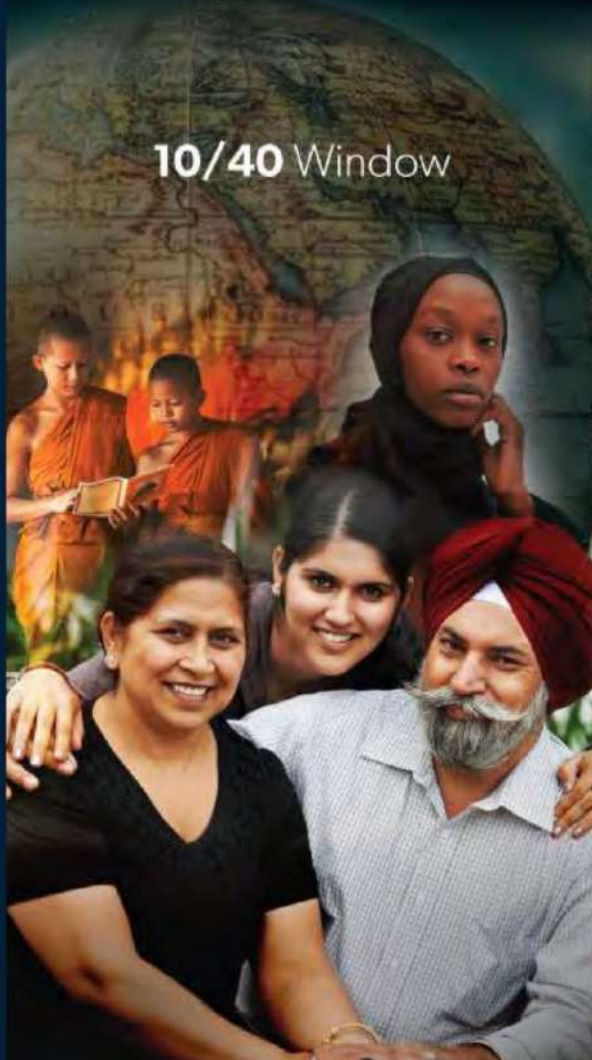
